




1954 NCR Corporation/Appleton Papers begin manufacturing carbonless paper using PCBs

Environmental Toxicity




Persistent, bioaccumulative toxin

1976 Toxic Substance Control Act


Point Source Release

River Sediment Contamination

Hot spots with over 1 ppm



Over 5.5 million m³ of sediment contaminated

Massive Cleanup

Remove 2.7 million m³ of sediment Cap another 2.8 million m³

1976 - 1985 Setting the Stage

 1976 DNR releases a major report on PCBs in the lower Fox River

1980 Super Fund Act

 Early 80's Initial analysis of damage, stakeholders, and legal remedies



1986 - 1995 Maneuvering

 1986 DNR begins a Remedial Action Plan (RAP) and forms planning committees

 1988 The RAP document is completed and implementation begins with public hearings



1989 DNR and U.S. Fish and Wildlife discuss legal action


1986 - 1995 Maneuvering

- 1991 EPA and DNR pinpoint areas for remediation. DNR opts out of Super Fund
- 1991 Environmental advocates disagree with government and industry
- 1991 State government and industry back Fox Wolf Watershed Alliance. Environment advocates form Clean Water Action Council
- 1992 DNR postpones legal action and creates the Fox River Coalition to mediate



1986 - 1995 Maneuvering

1995 With a Republican
Governor and Republican
majority in the state
legislature, the DNR is
downsized and the
Governor is given right to
fire and hire the DNR
Secretary

1996 – 2005 Legal Action and Agreements

- 1996 Wisconsin asks Fish and Wildlife, EPA, and other stakeholders to negotiate a MOU with the paper companies to avoid litigation
- 1997 Before a MOU is obtained Governor Thompson makes his own deal with the paper companies
- 1997 EPA threatens Super Fund action, blocking the Governor's agreement
- 1997 Paper companies walk out of negotiations






1996 – 2005 Legal Action and Agreements

- 2000 Fish and Wildlife completes a Natural Resource Damage Assessment and begins public hearings
- 2000-2007 Seven legal agreements or orders requiring paper companies to fund, design and/or complete the cleanup work
- 2001 DNR and EPA release cleanup plan for public comment and hold public hearings





1996 – 2005 Legal Action and Agreements

 2003 DNR and EPA release Record of Decision on cleanup plan

 2003 P.H.Glatfelter and Wisconsin Tissue Mill agree to carry-out and pay for the cleanup of one section of the river

 2005 An Administrative Order and Consent with NCR and Georgia Pacific is issued for a cleanup design for the rest of the river





2006 – 2017 Cleanup and Costs

2006-09 Section 1 is cleaned


2008 NCR/Appleton Papers sue 9 insurance companies, and court finds insurance companies liable

- 2009 Cleanup of Sections 2-5 starts
- 2009 NCR/Appleton Papers sue 20 companies and municipalities for contribution, but court rules no contribution
- 2017 Expected finish date for remediation

Laws with consequences



- Real threat of enforcement
- Attractive alternatives to enforcement
- Meaningful stakeholder involvement

- Transparency
- Limits on political interference
- Patience
